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HVA Deworming Recommendations 2012

*Only Equimax (IVM/PRZ) should be used in pregnant and/or lactating mares.

**Horses in this class initially often require serial fecal tests and may be dewormed with other products, such as fenbendazole (Panacur PowerPack) or moxidectin (Quest). We may make more specific recommendations for each horse in this class pending fecal results.

***We strongly recommend fecal testing for all horses. This would allow us to assign your horse to Class 1, 2, or 3 and make more specific recommendations.

DD PYR=a double dose of a product containing pyrantel pamoate, such as Strongid. For example, an average-sized, adult horse would be given TWO full tubes of paste at the same time.

IVM/PRZ=a product containing ivermectin and praziquantal, such as Equimax or Zimectrin Gold.

IVM=a product containing only ivermectin.

MOX/PRZ=a product containing moxidectin and praziquantal, such as Quest Plus.
